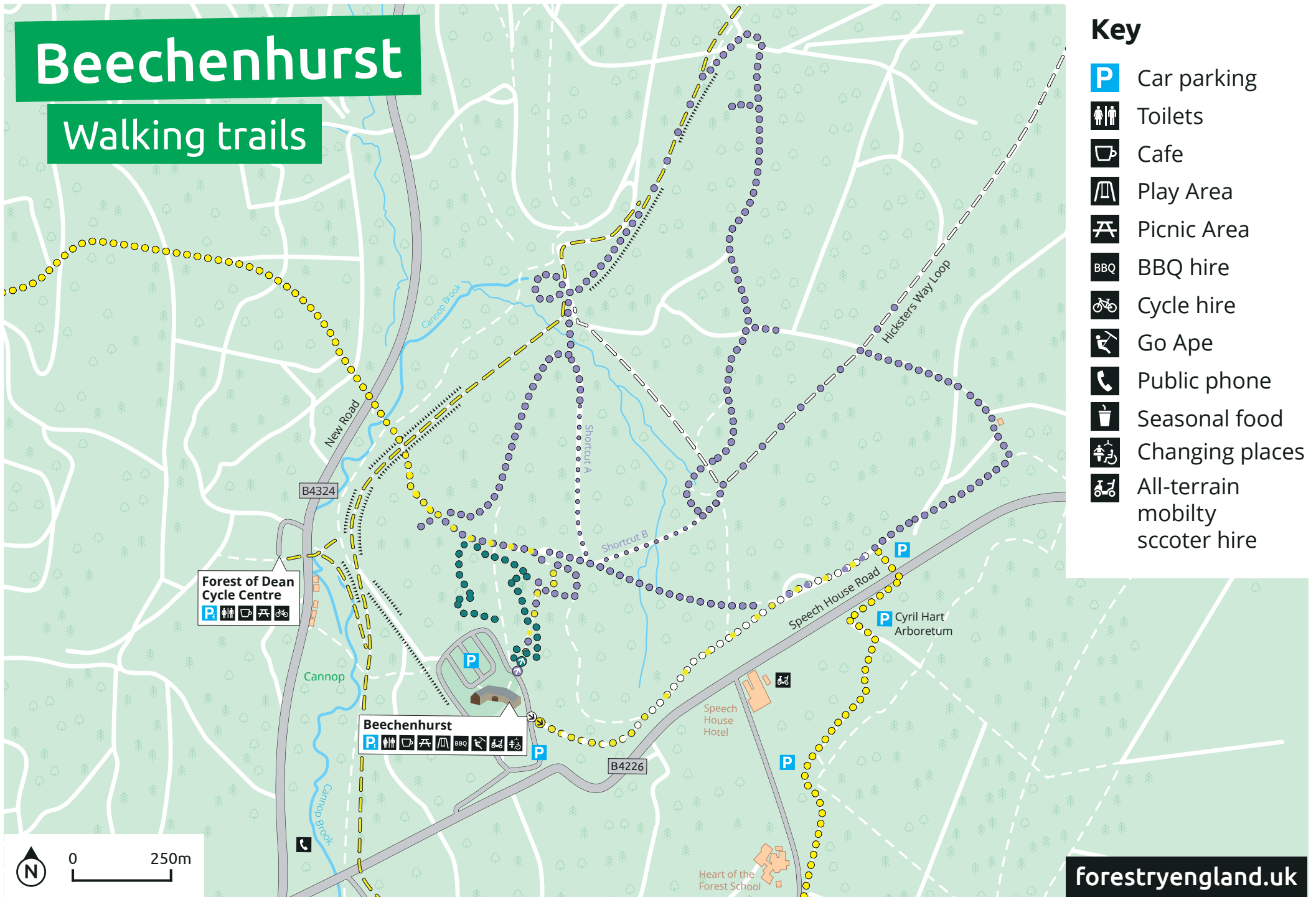

Walking trails at Beechenhurst

There are miles of tracks to discover here at Beechenhurst, or you can explore the woodland along one of these routes.

Walking trails

Beechenhurst Trail ●●●

13km (8 miles)

This 'ramblers route' explores the north-west part of the forest. A challenging walk with lots of hills on unsurfaced paths. This trail is not fully waymarked, so an OS Explorer Map OL14 is advised. More information can be found at fodramblers.org.uk

Glade Trail ●●●

1km (0.62 miles)

This all ability access route meanders through mixed woodland before returning to Beechenhurst through the Glade. Along the route there are information panels with things for you to look out for as you walk.

Sculpture Trail ●●●

7.7km (4.8 miles)

Shortcut A: 3.2km (2 miles)

Shortcut B: 5km (3.1 miles)

This thought-provoking trail takes in a series of sculptures inspired by the forest; its trees, wildlife and industrial past. The trail uses a mix of hardstone tracks and unsurfaced pathways with two shortcut options available. More information is available at the trail start and trail leaflets can be purchased from the cafe or info point.

Walking trails nearby

Speech House link Trail ○○○

1km (0.6 miles)

An uphill link to Speech House Woodlands, passing close to Cyril Hart Arboretum and the historic Speech House. If you do venture off the path, take care crossing the road.

Cyril Hart Arboretum Path

1km (0.6 miles)

Established over 100 years ago by plant collector Ernest Wilson, the arboretum has over 200 species of tree. The path is not waymarked but is easy to follow and surfaced for easy-access.
