

Walking trail at Nutcombe Bottom

Follow the Tall Trees Trail to see Nutcombe Bottom's tallest and most impressive trees, including several of the tallest species examples in England. This part of Nutcombe Bottom was originally planted as an arboretum (a specially chosen collection of trees).

The trail is about 600m long and crosses four bridges set over a meandering stream. Great for little legs and people of all abilities.
